

Joint Coordination Group

Over the last weeks, a number of stakeholders working within the end-to-end spectrum of vaccine development and delivery have been invited to join the CEPI Joint Coordination Group (JCG). The purpose of the JCG is to provide a platform for engagement, enable coordination between partners, and serve as a mechanism for giving recommendations to CEPI.

Potential partners have been invited to sign a Memorandum of Understanding and attend the first JCG meeting on November 18 in Geneva. Overall, the response has been very positive, and we are looking forward to hearing views on how CEPI can be an impactful organization and contribute to filling gaps in vaccines development. Summary review on vaccine regulatory pathways important for CEPI

This summary review on vaccine regulatory pathways important for CEPI was initiated under Task Team 1, specifically the sub-groups looking at clinical development and regulatory affairs groups. The purpose of this summary is to provide an overview of the current regulatory standards available for EIDs in an emergency. This summary will be a reference for future work related to vaccine and regulatory pathways important for CEPI and an important tool to further engage and work with regulatory partners on collaborative efforts to provide advice and negotiate on regulatory and ethical pathways for vaccines for and during epidemics. A working group focused on regulatory affairs will develop a work plan and coordinate further work with the CEPI SAC and JCG.
