International Sanctions Policy

Objective

The purpose of this policy is to ensure that the Coalition for Epidemic Preparedness Innovations (CEPI) complies with international sanctions.

Definitions

International sanctions: International sanctions refer to the restriction or suspension of economic or commercial relations, or other areas such as transport and communications or diplomatic relations, with a particular state or groups of individuals and entities.

Policy statement

CEPI respects and complies with international sanctions. CEPI may not be able to fund vaccine development projects if the awardee, anyone associated with the award or the activities of the awardee are

- The target of international sanctions; or
- Located in a country that is the target of such sanctions.

While CEPI conducts routine sanction checks as part of our initial due diligence award process, CEPI expects applicants and awardees to notify CEPI if they suspect that international sanctions may affect their award at any time during the award period.

CEPI expects CEPI-funded researchers and their host organisations to take responsibility for complying with all applicable laws and ensuring that any person working on the funded activities (including any collaborator, sponsor, supervisor, consultant, sub-awardee, contractor, supplier or other third party) is not the subject of international sanctions.
